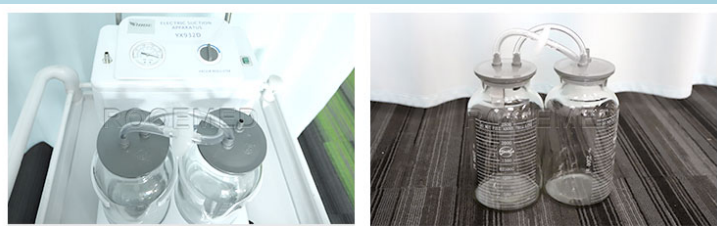

DENGUE OUTBREAK IN BANGLADESH



Dengue is endemic in Bangladesh, with yearly increases and peaks in reported cases and deaths around the monsoon season. This year, the upsurge in cases started earlier (around the last week of April) compared to previous years. As of 27 August 2023, 119 133 patients and 569 deaths have been from all 64 country districts. This makes it the country's largest outbreak of dengue fever in terms of the number of reported cases, including deaths and the nationwide spread. The scale, urgency, and seasonality have also pressured the health system. WHO is the leading partner to support the national authorities to mount a coordinated response to the outbreak. This situation report (SITREP) summarizes the status of the epidemic and some of the support.
